## Hadrash Ve-Haiyun Dor Revi'i Torah Insights on the Weekly Parsha

This is the thing that Hashem has commanded, gather from it for every man according to what he eats, an omer per person, according to the number of your souls, everyone according to whomever is in his tent shall you take (Shemos 16:16).

In this week's parsha we learn about the ma'an. Every day each individual would gather a portion of heavenly bread. The phenomenon of ma'an was nothing less than miraculous. Indeed, the Hebrew letters of the word ma'an are mem and nun, an acronym for ma'aseh nissim, a miraculous act.

The commentators note that the above posuk which commands the Jewish people to gather a precise portion of ma'an contains every letter of the aleph beis. There is only one other posuk in the Torah that similarly has every letter of the aleph beis. It is found in parshas Va'eschanan. The posuk there says "Or has any god ever performed miracles to come to take for himself a nation from amidst a nation, with challenges, with signs and with wonders and with war and with a strong hand and with an outstretched arm and with greatly awesome deeds such as everything that Hashem your God did for you in Egypt before your eyes (Devarim 4:34). It is noteworthy that there as well, the posuk makes mention of the miracles that Hashem performed for the Jewish people.

What is the symbolic significance that only these two posukim contain every letter of the aleph beis?

Chazal tell us that the letters of the aleph beis are symbolic of the study of Torah. Indeed, the Gemara tells us that the letters of the aleph beis stand for aloph binah, which means "learn understanding," a reference to the study of Torah.

We may suggest that these two posukim teach us that Hashem miraculously sustains us only in the merit of the study of Torah. The difference between the two posukim is that our parsha focuses on the individual whereas the posuk in Va'eschanan focuses on the nation as a whole.

In our parsha the Torah shows us how Hashem provided sustenance for each and every individual. The posuk says, "an omer per person." It includes every letter of the aleph beis to underscore that sustenance was provided only in the merit of Torah study. In parshas Va'eschanan the Torah tells us how Hashem performed miracles for the Jewish people as a whole. Here the focus is the nation. The words of the posuk are "a nation from amidst a nation." Again, here the Torah includes every letter of the aleph beis to

indicate that these miracles were only performed in the merit of Torah study.

There are people who believe that it is worthwhile to support institutions and programs that advance the study of Torah. However, some of these people also feel that it is not important for each and every individual to devote time to the study of Torah.

On the other hand there are those who believe that it is important for every individual to study Torah but not worthwhile enough that the community support institutions devoted to its study.

We learn from these two posukim that both attitudes are wrong. It is essential that both the individual and the community devote themselves to the study of Torah. It is only in its merit that Hashem miraculously sustains us.

## Daven for Your Beautiful Esrog TODAY!!!

The Mishna in Rosh HaShana says there are four Rosh HaShanas during the course of the year. The Rosh HaShana for the trees is on Tu B'Shvat according to Bais Hillel. Unlike all the other Rosh HaShanas counted in the Mishna where it says the plural form of the category that is having Rosh HaShana (e.g., Kings, Years, Plants, etc.) by Shvat it says the singular Rosh HaShana for "the tree." The Bnei Yisaschar says that on Tu B'Shvat although it is Rosh Hashana for all trees there is one tree that we focus our attention on this special day. We have a kabala to daven for our esrog for the upcoming Succos. We daven to Hashem that he should provide us with a kosher and beautiful esrog. This we see in the Mishna which also only mentions that Tu B'Shvat is the Rosh Hashana for "the tree" and not all the trees. When you are scrambling for a good esrog next year, remember how much you davened on Tu B'Shvat and you'll know what kind of esrog you'll end up with.

## Focus on Shabbos Sedrah Selections – Selections

Ch. 5, v. 12: "Kaasher tzivcho Hashem Elokecho" – As Hashem your G-d has commanded you.

We do not find these words by the command to remember the Shabbos in the Ten Commandments of parshas Yisro. Although Rashi says that "as Hashem your G-d has commanded you" refers to the command in Moroh before the Torah was given, the Meshech Chochmoh offers a most novel differing explanation. The Ramban on Vayikra 23:24 writes that the words "y'h'yeh lochem Shabbosone" teach us that besides the 39 restricted acts of Shabbos transgression the

Rabbis were empowered with deciding which acts are also restricted on Shabbos because they take away from the sanctity of the day. This includes business transactions, moving and arranging items in a warehouse, movement of "muktzoh" items, etc. If these acts would be permitted there is the fear that one would take up the day with arranging stock, etc. In the desert this concern had no place, as people were not involved in business activities all week. They had their housing, food, and clothing provided for in a miraculous way. Hence there was no need to warn against such activities. In our parsha, where the new generation of bnei Yisroel that would enter Eretz Yisroel and live a "natural" existence was being addressed, the prohibition against such activities is in place. The Meshech Chochmoh concludes that "kaasher tzivcho" refers to the command "y'h'yeh lochem Shabbosone" in parshas Emor.

Ch. 5, v. 15, "V'zocharto ki eved ho'yisro b'erezt Mitzrayim va'yotziacho" – And you shall remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt and He took you out.

Shabbos of the Ten Commandments in parshas Yisro is a reminder that Hashem created the world in six days and desisted from creation on the seventh day (Shmos 20:11). We mention both ideas in our Friday night kiddush, "zikorone l'maa'sei v'reishis," and "zeicher litzias Mitzroyim." Why do we say "zikorone" in relation to the creation of the world and "zeicher" in relation to being taken out of Egypt?

Obviously, we must first explain the difference between these two words.

Based on the Rada"k in his Sefer Hashoroshim entry "ish," who writes that the word "ishon," the pupil of the eye, is sourced from "ish," a person, and the Vov-Nun suffix indicates the diminutive form, we can say that "zikorone" is a small remembrance and "zeicher" is a full-fledged remembrance.

The Maharal of Prague in Gvuross Hashem chapter #44 writes that if Shabbos would be limited to being a remembrance of the creation of the world only, it would follow that all mankind would be required to sanctify the day. It is only because it is also a remembrance that Hashem took the Jewish nation out of Egypt to serve Him, and this created a unique relationship, limited to the bnei Yisroel to the exclusion of others, that Shabbos is to be kept only by the bnei Yisroel. Not only that, but a ben Noach may NOT keep the Shabbos even on a voluntary basis.

We now understand why as a commemoration of the creation of the world Shabbos is a minor theme, "zikorone," and as a commemoration of the exodus from Egypt it is a major theme, "zeicher." (Nirreh li)
